Art Projects Friendship Bracelet

Measure a Friend

Partner children with a friend and have them measure one another's height using non-traditional measuring tools such as a shoe or pencil. Have them report their friend's height in non-traditional units. For example, "Sally is seven shoes tall".



Early Literacy Take Home: Ask your child to name some of his or her friends. Help them identify the first letter sound in each friend's name. Identifying letter sounds is an essential literacy building block.
