Art Projects

Start a real or imaginary garden. Have children write the names of the plants on popsicle sticks and place in the real or literal garden.

Science & Math

Seed Match

Find pictures of plants and the seeds or vines that go with them. Match them.

Plant seeds

Plant seeds and watch them grow. Talk with the child(ren) in your life about what makes a plant flourish.

What's Inside?

Take fruits such as an apple, pear, peach, cantaloupe, or pumpkin. Have child(ren) predict whether or not there are seeds in the middle and how many seeds there might be. Open the fruit up and examine the seeds, look at size and number of seeds.

Early Literacy Take Home:

Take a walk through a garden or a park with your child. Talk about the plants and animals you see along the way. Talking with your child about everyday things helps them build vocabulary skills.
