ORDINANCE NO. 7
AN ORDINANCE regulating the maintenance of sidewalks, walkways and footpaths within the Town of Forks and imposing a penalty for infraction thereof.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FORKS, as follows:
SECTION I. From and after the date of the taking effect of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the owners, lessees and/or other persons having control and entitled to the possession of all premises within the corporate limits of the Town of Forks abutting upon or contiguous to a sidewalk, walkway or footpath to keep such sidewalk, walkway or footpath in good repair and maintainance and the same shall be reasonably safe and convenient for
