THIS WEEK IN WASHINGTON HISTORY

Clerks of Astor's Pacific Fur Company close the Port Ozamog site for an inland trading post September 1, 1811. It was situated at the confluence of the Okanogan and Columbia rivers, which was ideal as to climate soil and the well-wooded river, with fish, it was within easy access to the northern interior by means of the two rivers, while to the south the Columbia would become the highway to Astoria. Spokane House had already been established 140 miles further up the Columbia by the Northwest Company, and the Okanogan site was close enough to keep the rival establishment in check.

This will be a get acquainted night and all mothers of the community with a pre-school child are cordially invited to attend.

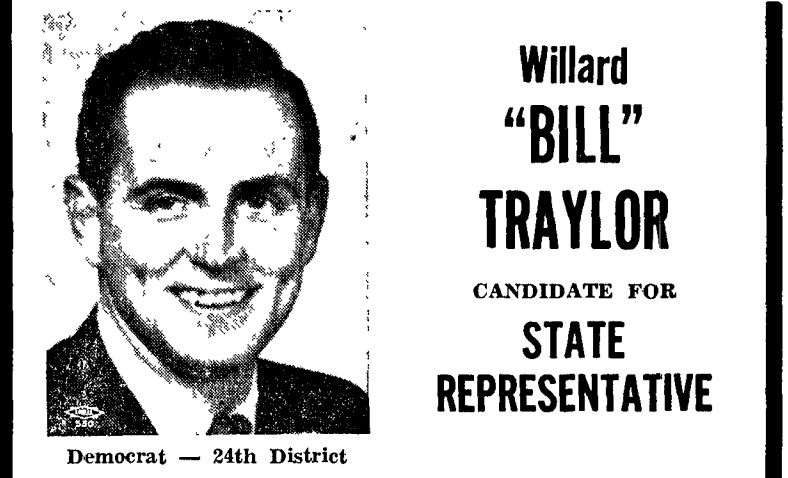

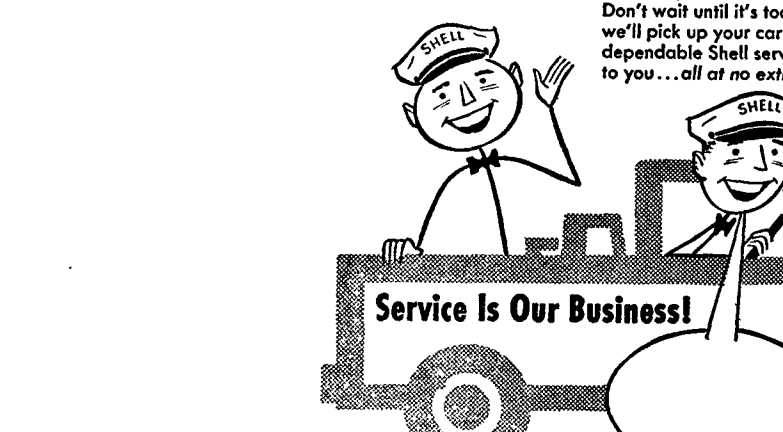

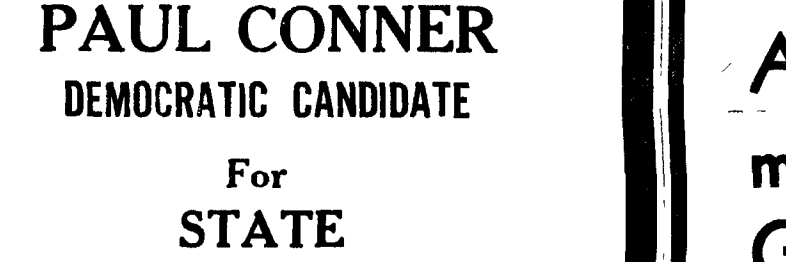
