P.U.D. And The Cable Hold-Up ...

"The P.U.D. is cooperating in every way possible to bring the Forks area better television reception. Correspondents, conferences and field trips have been made with T.V. cable representatives to resolve some of the difficulty of using poles and facilities which were originally designed for the distribution of power only."

"We are prohibited by law to restrict working and climbing space on poles. The television companies, the public and the P.U.D. must be protected from the hazards of placing facilities below electric lines energized up to 69,000 volts."

"To protect the public investment the P.U.D. is insured in excess of 2 million dollars. Surely some of this liability protection should be borne by others using P.U.D. facilities."

UW Homecoming This Saturday

Defending AAUW Conference champion Oregon State, this season for the first time coached by former Idaho mentor Doc Anderson, plays the role of Homecoming opponent to the Washington Huskies, this Saturday (November 13) at Seattle's UW Stadium.

The rejuvenated Huskies, behind the passing arm of Tod Hollin and the receiving end Dave Williams, have come to the second half of the '65 campaign. After losing four of its first five games, Washington rebounded to upset the Oregon and Stanford teams on consecutive Saturdays. Last week the Huskies lost to UCLA at Los Angeles.

The Huskies' defense had likewise come alive and the Huskies are now stopping most opponent's offensive attacks. All-America tackle candidate Fred Forsberg has been playing brilliant ball after losing much of his effectiveness due to an early season ankle sprain.

The Huskies and the Beavers have played a 51 games series, dating back to 1897. Washington has won 27, Oregon State 20, with ties.

Social Security Service in Forks

The Social Security Administration, in cooperation with the Forks City Council and Mayor Earl Kennedy, is beginning a comprehensive study to determine how best to provide the Forks area with regular social security service.

In the past it has been necessary for Forks residents to travel to Port Angeles to discuss their social security problems with a representative.

On November 26, John Van Sant, Social Security resident representative in Port Angeles, will begin making regular monthly visits to Forks. On the last Friday of each month Mr. Van Sant will open a temporary office in the council chambers of the Forks City Hall. Official office hours will be 10 a.m. until noon, but these may be extended as the need arises.

The ever increasing population outgrew the facilities in the old building and bids were called for the construction of a new post office which first opened here in the late '90s. Since then the population has naturally grown considerably and through the years the post office has moved eight times.

Increase In Social Security

A small leaflet, prepared by the Social Security Administration, is available to employers as a payroll check-off form. The leaflet explains the increase in the social security contribution rate and amount of earnings on which the tax is paid. It also shows how these increases will affect a worker's take home pay; how his contribution helps finance retirement, survivors, and disability insurance benefits; how they will pay the costs of the hospital insurance part of Medicare; and why they are necessary.

The handy size of the leaflet will allow it to be easily inserted in payroll envelopes. Employers should get in touch with the Port Angeles resident station, located in Room 5 of the Port Angeles Post Office Building, for more information about the leaflet.
