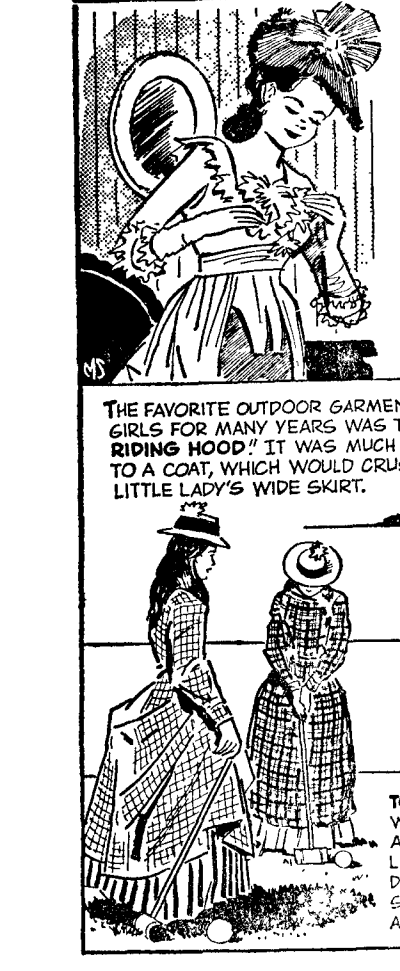

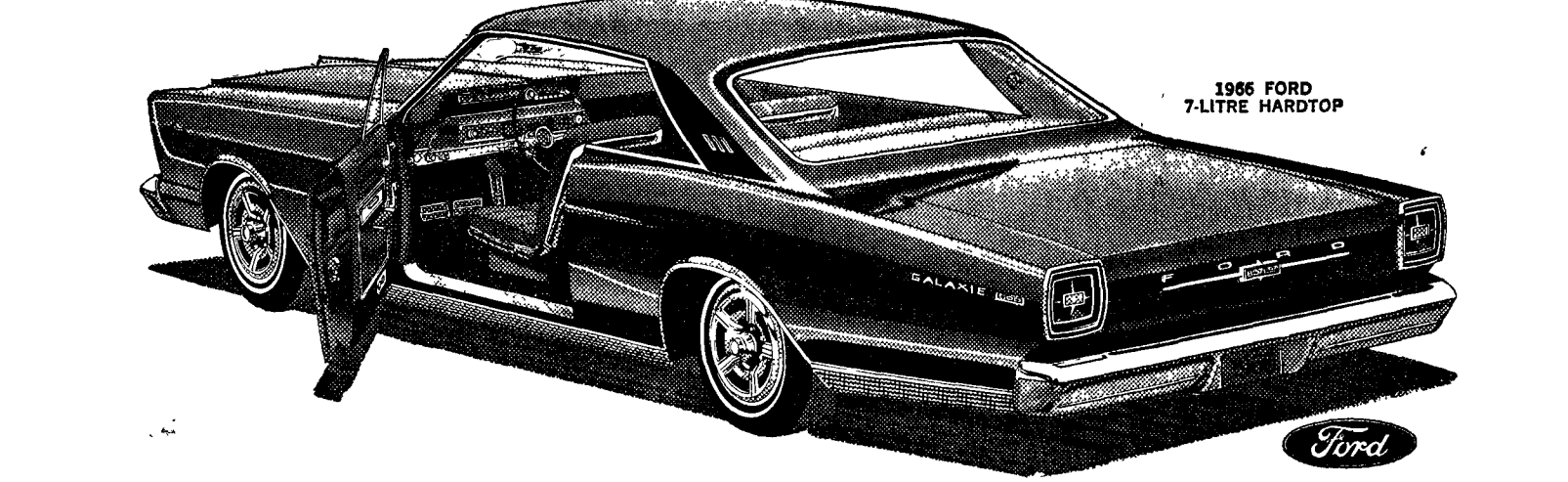

(Continued from page one) sister, Lena Meredith and her small daughter Magda, (now Mrs. Carl Kaumle) occupied the upper rooms, the first story being devoted to post office, telephone switch board, drugs and incidentals. Don't ask me how Lena managed to attend to all these when the doctor was out on a case. He soon found grumpy patients however, in Chairman Bay, Hugh Palmer became acting postmaster for a few months. Early in 1917 Dan Shearer received his commission as postmaster. He was some what of a newcomer having arrived in 1914, like Dr. Koenig, Dan had to build a house before he could take over the post office with a lobby and a buzzer to signal if service was wanted during slack hours—and there were more slack hours than busy ones.

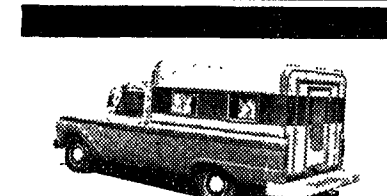
Dan had plenty of outdoor work he was anxious to get at. After everything was squared away his wife, Kathryn, took over. Her official title was Acting Postmaster and she did practically all the real acting he required for several years.

One early morning in the fall of 1920, Dan appeared at his door and asked me without preliminaries, "How would you like to take over the post office?"

"When?" I asked. "Today," Dan replied. "This is so sudden?" I parried but I made up my mind just as suddenly.

Within an hour Dan was putting me to the ropes. That same day he sent in his resignation, recommended my appointment to the office, and requested permission to have the post office moved to the east. Within a month I received the appointment as Acting Postmaster and all the responsibilities to the post office were installed in the quiet-quieted house in the living room. The following year I received my commission as full fledged postmaster, signed by President Woodrow Wilson.

Let's digress a bit. The year 1923 was a busy year. We started out having a fire that destroyed every business house on the east side of the highway, then merely a county

Peace-time veterans have a definite advantage under the Federal Housing Administration Mortgage Insurance for Veterans provided by the new Public Law 89-117, but veterans will benefit more under the GI Loan Guaranty Program, John B. Diabetes...

The experts have estimated that there are more than 1,700,000 diabetics in the United States, and that there are about 1,620,000 more Americans who have diabetes and don't know it. These figures are plus untold hundreds of diabetics who are not properly treated. If they don't follow a balanced diet, keep their weight down and have regular medical examinations by their doctors to detect early changes in how their bodies use sugar. It is a disease in which the body cannot use the carbohydrates, fats, and sugars and starches. Diabetes can be controlled by planned diets and in many cases, insulin or oral medication. Well-known diabetics can give active and useful lives. Most likely candidates for diabetes are those who are over 40, particularly those who are related to diabetics, and especially older women. But diabetes can hit anyone at any age. Symptoms in advance cases include increase in urination, loss of weight, frequent urination, loss of weight, itching, especially of the feet, vision and slow healing of cuts.
