**Hunter Give Annual Assist**

Again this year every twentyn hunter in Washington will receive a questionnaire from the Department of Game, Fish and Forestry. This questionnaire is used in the State Game Department.

The questionnaire, which was mailed last month, is sent to a 5 percent sample of all hunters. Those to receive it are randomly selected from hunting licence stubs. This procedure, plus the relatively large sample size, guarantees accurate information.

All hunters are requested to fill in and return the questionnaire. The questionnaire is being prepared by the Department of Game, Fish and Forestry. It is equally important that the unsuccessful hunter return his form.

Completed, returned questionnaires are analyzed by IBM machines. The figures on the hunting trends become evident.

The accumulated data, as well as the number of persons hunting major species and their degree of success.

Final information is printed and available to any interested person when analysis is complete, normally in mid-March.

The type of survey used by the Game Department has been found successful in business operations and in other government agencies.

A check of the project by trained statisticians at both state universities shows that the collected deer and elk harvest figures are accurate with a few percent.

All persons receiving the questionnaire, whether successful or not in 1965 hunting seasons, are urged to return the completed form as soon as possible so that the Game Department may analyze and gain full use from this citizen's assist to the game management program of Washington.

**Who Must File A Federal Income Tax Return**

Everyone under 65 years old (whether single or married) who is a citizen or resident of the United States and had gross income of \$600 or more during the year must file a return. Neal S. Warren, District Director of the Internal Revenue Service for the State of Washington reminded taxpayers today.

If you are 65 or older on the last day of your tax year, no return is required unless gross income was \$1,000 or more. If your income is under the above figure, you should nevertheless file a return to obtain the refund due to you from any income tax withheld from salaries or wages.

Businessmen, farmers, and professional men or women who are self-employed must file a return if net earnings from self-employment were \$400 or more.

Document No. 5107, which furnished more detailed information on this subject, may be obtained by writing to the District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Seattle, Washington 98121.
