## Forks Players Named To All-Conference Basketball Team

Congratulations to GARY JOHN, SON, DOUG HANAN, and BOB MILLER for being named to the All-Conference basketball team selected by Scooter Chapman, sports editor of the Post. Gary John was named to the first team and Doug and Bob were given honorable mention.

Coach Jeff Busby and Ralph Hill have released statistics concerning the recently completed basketball season and they are as follows:

**VARSITY** — Doug Hanan was the best shooter from the floor as he connected on 51 of 105 field goal attempts for a 48.5 percent average. Wayne Calkins was the best free throw shooter as he converted 24 of 46 free throw attempts for a 52 percent average. Gary Johnson was the high point man for the Spartans this year as he scored 266 points for a 14.1 per game average.

It was closely followed by Phil Kitchel who scored 215 points for an 11.6 points per game average. Gary Johnson, with 122, had the largest number of assists. Gary also had the largest number of interceptions with 56. Johnson was also the "bad boy" of the team with 57 fouls.

**JUNIOR VARSITY** — LARRY SIMMONS was the best shooter from the floor as he converted 32 of 49 free throw attempts for a 65.3 percent average. Larry Simmons was the most accurate free throw shooter with a 68.3 shooting percentage. He was closely followed by Rick Walker who connected on 29 of 70 field goal attempts for a 41.4 percent average.

**FRESHMAN** — SAN PETERSON garnered several honors for the Jayces this season. He was high point man in 128 games and gathered in 128 rebounds. He also had 15 assists and 48 interceptions. Stan also collected 46 fouls for the season.
