Application No. 30071... Macfield Ridge located approximately 8 miles west of Forks. The sale is composed of all timber bounded by sale area boundary lines, logged areas and property lines on part SW 1/4 NE 1/4, part SE 1/4 NE 1/4, and part NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 26, all in Township 32 North, Range 14 West, W.M., containing 150 acres, more or less, comprising approximately 621,000 sq. ft. of hemlock and white fir; 2,550 sq. ft. of hemlock and white fir; 6,231,000 sq. ft. of Douglas fir and others; or a total of 8,857,000 sq. ft. Minimum acceptable bid per thousand bd. ft. \$12.50 for hemlock and white fir; \$14.00 for Douglas fir and others; and \$20.00 for spruce and others.
