Lynn D. LaFave Memorial Scholarship Presented

Lynn Dale LaFave, Northwest Ophthalmologist and Forks biology teacher, was caught in the undergrowth and drowned June 8, 1966, while participating in C.I.T.O. picnic at Kalalook. Washington Park Department recreation area. Four Hanan went to his rescue but found the undergrowth and the weight too much. LaFave was taken from the water, and flown to Grays Harbor General Hospital by the Coast Guard helicopter. He was pronounced dead on arrival.

Mr. LaFave was born May 30, 1932 at North Fork, North Dakota. Later with his family, Mr. and Mrs. C. A. LaFave, he moved to Spokane where he graduated from John H. Rogers High School in 1951. He was awarded the grand prize for his collection at the annual Pacific Northwest Fair.

LaFave was past president and current vice-president of the Inland Empire Northwest Bird and Mammal Society. He was also a member of several national science associations. He was a holder of state and national collectors permits to gather scientific specimens for Washington University in St. Louis, University of Washington museums and the Smithsonian Institution and the Natural History Museum. LaFave contributed his scientific findings to several books and many publications. Lynn LaFave worked his way through Eastern Washington State College as an engineer for the Great Northern Railroad. He had taught Biology at Forks High School for one year.

Because of Lynn LaFave's dedication to both science and education a memorial scholarship fund has been set up in his name. The recipient is to be one who will be studying in some field of science. This year recipient plans to study for one of two fields: either a biology teacher or a research biologist. His name is DOUG HANAN.

We hope that this will be a perpetual fund, with an award made each year. Contributions would be welcome from anyone interested in making by contacting Forks High School either by phone or writing.

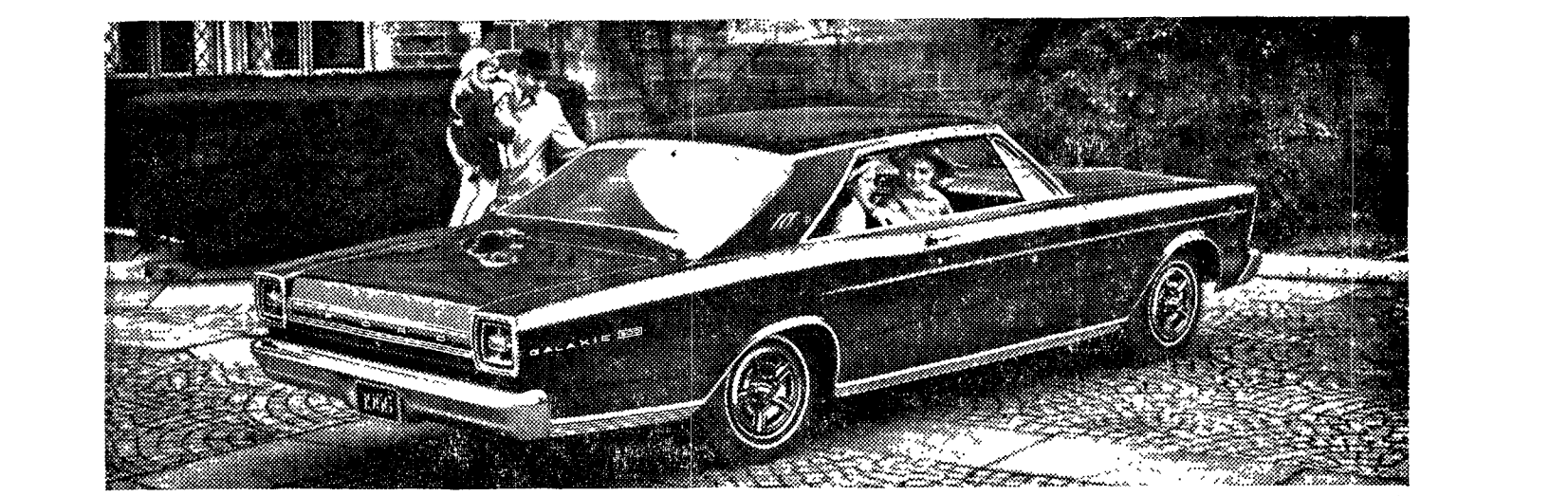

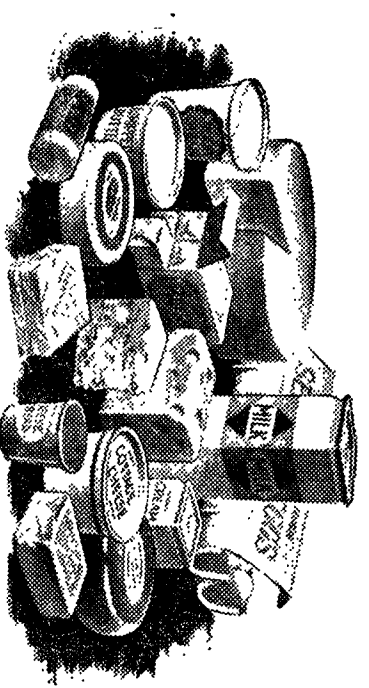
