Openings For Job Corps

A Corpsman may spend from a few months to two years in the Job Corps. Each month he will receive \$30 spending money; when he leaves, he will receive an additional \$50 for each month of satisfactory service. If a Corpsman has been helping support his family in the past, he may send home up to \$25 a month. This amount will be matched by the Job Corps.

In addition to the training, each Job Corpsman will be given aid in finding employment. Joining the armed services, or returning to school when he graduates.

In a conservation center, 100 to 200 Corpsmen do conservation work and improve recreation facilities on the Nation's public lands. Projects undertaken by the centers include construction of camp grounds and other recreation areas, reforestation, logging, landscaping and building. Corpsmen may learn job skills such as forestry, insect control, weed control, and vehicle and heavy equipment operation and maintenance.

Urban centers offer 1,000 to 2,000 young men specialized, intensive vocational training in addition to basic education. Urban centers concentrate on teaching specific occupational skills. A Corpsman may train to become an office machine operator, an appliance or automobile repairman, a machine tool operator, a sales clerk, an ac-

countant, or a hospital technician. All occupational courses have been carefully chosen to provide skills for which there is and will continue to be a strong national demand.

Trainees are provided with a total learning experience. All Corpsmen live at a Job Corps Center. They work, attend classes, and follow courses of individual instruction in close contact with professional teachers and counselors. A typical day for a Corpsman includes work, job skill training, individual study, and discussion sessions.

Education programs concentrate on reading, speaking, writing, and arithmetic are conducted in all Job Corps Centers. Each Corpsman's educational needs are diagnosed on an individual basis, and the entire program is geared to young people who have not benefited from conventional schooling.

In addition to the educational program, all Corpsmen learn how and where to apply for a job, what to say in an interview, and how to fill out an application for employment. Further, each graduate of Job Corps will receive help in finding a job.

Vehicle Safety Laws

Many motorists are understandably not totally familiar with the vehicle safety laws of the state of Washington. There are too many rules and regulations for any one person to know them all.

There are, however, some basic laws that all drivers should make themselves aware of, say State Troopers.

One of the more important laws is that of speeds to be driven under adverse conditions. Many people appear to feel that they must drive the speed as stated along the highways regardless of what conditions may be. This, of course, is the opposite of what the laws was intended for. If, for example, the road is covered with ice and snow, drivers should drive considerably slower than if the road was dry and unobstructed. There are times when 25-30 miles per hour is as fast as any driver should travel when the roadway is slippery, even though the regular speed may be listed as 70 miles per hour. However, the 70 miles-per-hour speed is designed to be traveled only under ideal conditions—no adverse weather conditions, traffic not heavy, visibility

good, etc. If for any reason the driving conditions are not ideal, then the law provides for each driver to slow down and drive accordingly.

Even a heavy rain is a valid reason to slow down—especially after a dry spell—because oils have accumulated on the highways, and the rain mixing with them causes the surface to be extremely slippery. Further, in a heavy down-pour, visibility is lessened considerably; another good reason for reducing speed.

State Troopers urge that you drive according to existing conditions—it's not only the law, but it's good common sense.

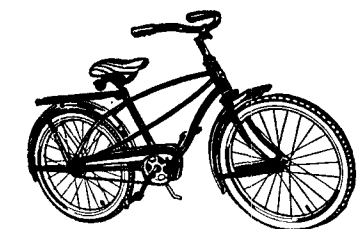
