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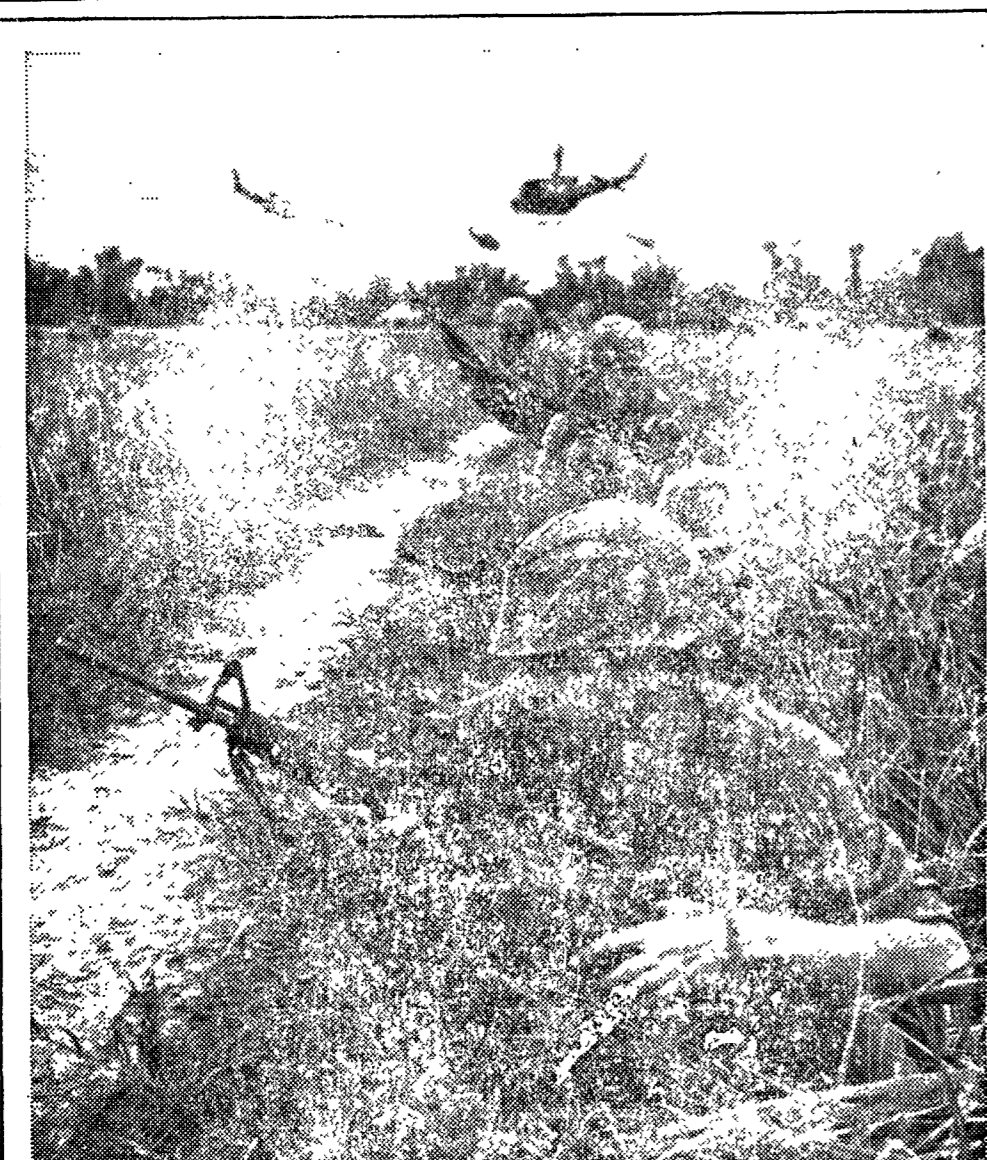

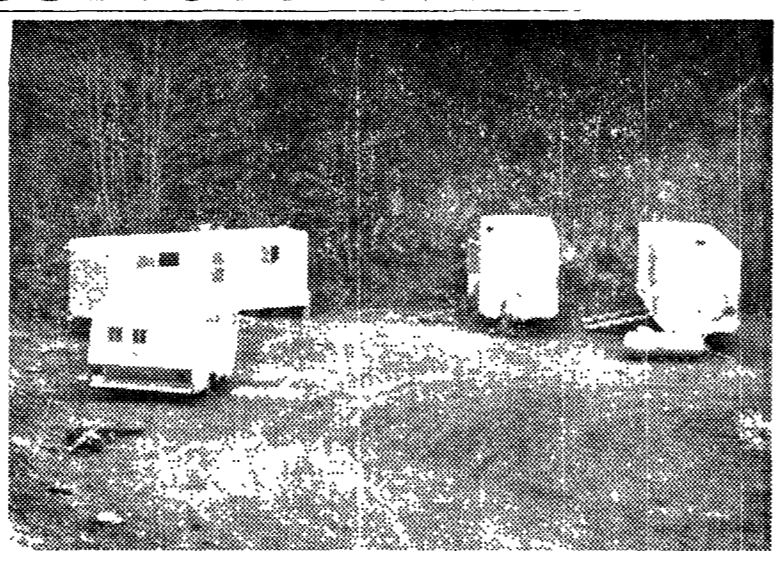

Special Decals Authorized

New license decals for farm vehicles will be available at county auditors' offices throughout the state starting July 17, the Department of Motor Vehicles reports. The special decals were authorized by the 1967 legislature to permit farmers to move their work vehicles on public roads from one field or farm to another without paying full license fees.

The black and white, 2" by 6" decals will cost \$5 and will be valid for the life of the vehicle, or until ownership of the vehicle is transferred. Any truck, pickup or other vehicle used mainly on the farm in agricultural operations is eligible for the farm decal. However, such a vehicle must be "only incidentally operated or moved along public highways . . . within a radius of 15 miles of the farm where principally used or garaged."

FORKS RAINDROPS FRANCES ETCHISON

This seems to be the year for that elusive added something in Forks. The unusual winter weather followed by our special summer and the extra special heavy catch by Salmon fishermen at La Pash. Most fishermen are ignoring the hefty runs of silver which are concentrated farther out to try for the massive Chinook salmon most of which are showing at 15 pounds or better. If you haven't gone this season—give it a try. It's the best fishing in the area for five years.

Fire fighters battled to control a fire covering more than 35,000 acres on the Quinalt Indian Reservation in Grays Harbor County. The fire which started last Thursday afternoon at a logging operation, spread through a cedar slash area and heavy green timber. Fire fighters included 80 men from Washington State Honor camps at Clallam Bay, Larch Mountain and Washougal and many men from the logging operations in the Forks area.

Two helicopters, one equipped to drop fire retardants, were used with over 500 men, 17 bulldozers and 16 pump trucks. The fire located 10 miles west of Amanda Park is on the Quinalt Indian Reservation and private land.

New Pre-Bill On Driver's License

Letting your driver license expire will cost you extra time and money after August 1, the Department of Motor Vehicles reminded motorists today. The new State law which amended this year to provide that any person whose license has expired even one day past his birthday must take a re-examination and pay a \$2 exam fee. The new law will be strictly enforced after August 1, Motor Vehicles Director Douglas Tom said.

Formerly, persons whose licenses had expired had a 60-day "grace period" during which the re-examination and fee were waived. "The law was changed because it caused some confusion," Tom explained. "It caused people to think their expired driver licenses were valid during the so-called 'grace period' while actually they could have received a ticket for driving with an invalid license during that 60 days."

New "pre-bill" licenses, which are mailed to drivers whose licenses are about to expire, eliminate reference to the 60-day period. The first of the new pre-bills were mailed this month.

Be Cautious In Mountains

Planning a trip to the mountains to get away from the heat for a week or so? So are several million other American families at this time of year. The American Medical Association cautions that if you're headed for some really high mountains, above 7,000 feet, it would be wise to make the change gradually if you wish to avoid "high altitude sickness." Anyone who has made a trip to Mexico City can tell you of his troubles in this respect.

Try, if you can, to make the ascent over a span of days so that your body can adjust to the oxygen-poor "thin air" at higher elevations. Symptoms of high-altitude sickness are: drowsiness; headache; loss of appetite; nausea; vomiting; and a feeling of warmth and flushing of the face soon after arrival; troubled sleep; irritability, and shortness of breath.

There are some precautions that may help prevent distress if you have to make a fast trip from a low level to high elevations. Before the trip, get a good night's rest and avoid alcoholic beverages and heavy smoking. A good break fast an hour or so before departure is all right, but no food should be taken during the rest of the trip.

Reduce physical activity during the trip. Sit quietly as much as possible. After arrival in the high altitude area, go to bed for a few hours and eat very lightly. Indulge in only light physical activity during the first 24 hours. Walk down, if you feel like to climb steps to a hotel or lodge.

Patients with certain heart and respiratory conditions may encounter more serious discomfort from abrupt changes to high altitudes. However, physicians have noted that most patients with cardiac or pulmonary disease who can move around and engage in moderate activity at sea level most often can tolerate altitudes of 7,000 to 8,000 feet without serious effects.

If you have doubts as to whether you or someone in your family may suffer from a trip to the high mountains, consult your physician in advance.

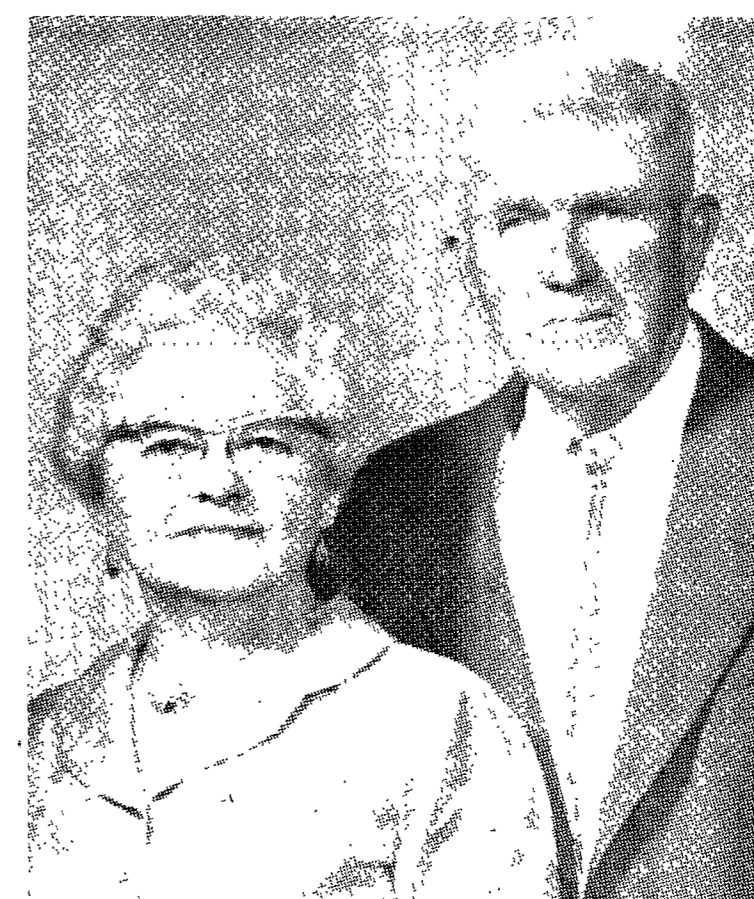
Elderly Hit By Frauds

The nation's older people have become the No. 1 target of confidence games and fraud, reports the National Better Business Bureau. Frequently, the Bureau says, these involve eggs in home repairs, sale of overpriced items with promises of credit for purchases from lists of prospective buyers furnished by the victims, debt-adjusting plans that simply add to what the victim already owes, false promises of big profits and little work under misleading franchise plans, dance-studio rackets, or mail-order propositions of worthless land.

Swimming Warning

When you go swimming at the seashore, beware of the "rip current" that can carry you seaward. The warning is from the Environmental Sciences Services Administration, which explains that a rip current is a strong, narrow current flowing straight out from shore. It can be spotted by the break, or cross-pattern, in lines parallel to the beach that are formed by surf. If you get caught in a rip current, ESSA advises you to swim parallel to the beach until you are out of the current, rather than swim against it. Money is whatever you make—it in your life.

Prepare For Four-Day Bible Instruction

Members of the Forks congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses are among 7,500 delegates making plans to attend a four-day Bible conference in Yakima, July 27-30.
