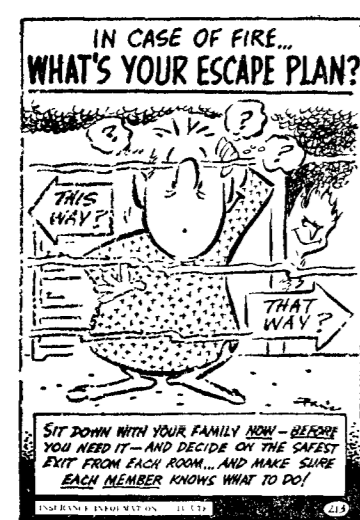

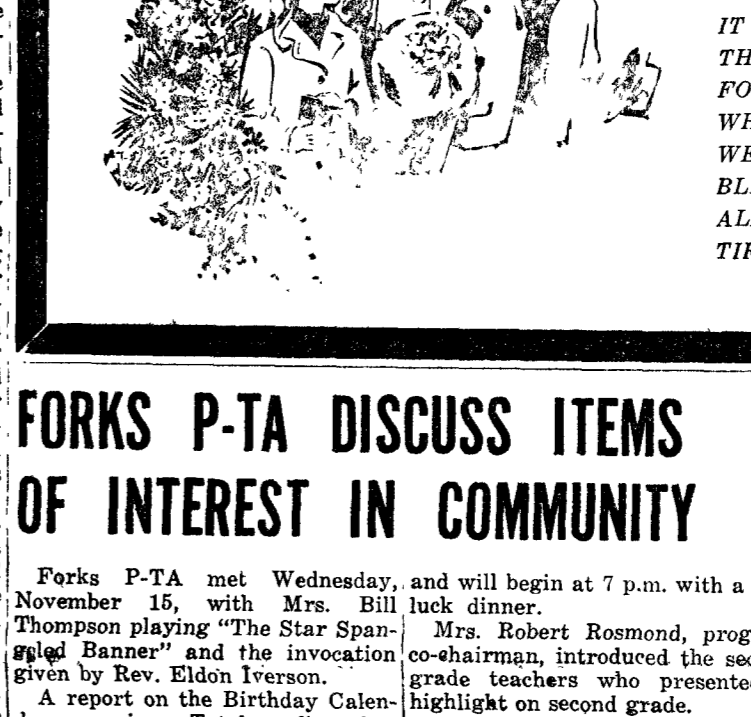

Measles: Questions and Answers

Q. Is measles a serious disease? A. Yes. It is the most serious of the common childhood diseases, causing much discomfort as well as temporary or permanent disability.

Q. How is the vaccine administered? A. By injection in the upper arm. Q. How safe is the measles vaccine? A. Millions of doses have already been distributed in the United States without serious complications.

Q. Are there any side effects caused by the vaccine? A. As with other vaccines, some children develop a fever after receiving measles vaccine. A few may even develop a mild rash. These symptoms may occur 7 to 12 days after vaccination.

Q. Can children receiving the vaccine spread measles to other persons? A. No. Q. If a parent is uncertain whether a child has had measles or measles vaccine before, should the child be vaccinated? A. Yes. To avoid an unnecessary injection however, parents should attempt to determine whether or not their children have had measles or measles vaccine in the past.

Q. What are the complications of measles? A. Complications can include ear infections, pneumonia, deafness, blindness, and convulsive disorders or other forms of brain disease. Encephalitis or brain fever occurs in a case in 1000, and may result in mental retardation. Temporary behavior disorders have been attributed to measles.

Q. What is the difference between measles and German measles? A. Measles (rubella) is a serious rash disease of children, and is sometimes called "hard", "red", "day", or old-fashioned measles. German measles (rubella) is a mild 3-day infection that seldom leads to complications in children. However, German measles may cause birth deformities in babies born to mothers who are infected with it when they are pregnant.

Q. Which form of measles is the present vaccine for? A. Measles vaccines for 7-day gamma globulin for measles exposure receive lasting immunity only if they subsequently develop a mild case of measles. Children who did not develop mild measles after receiving immune globulin may still be susceptible and should receive the vaccine.

Q. Who should receive measles vaccine? A. Healthy children beyond the age of 1 year who have never had measles or measles vaccine. Q. Is measles vaccine needed by older children and adults? A. No, because nearly all people over the age of 15 have had measles, and thus are already immune.

Q. Will other immunization interfere with the measles vaccine? A. Diphtheria-Whooping Cough-Tetanus Immunization (DPT) will not interfere. However, there should be at least a 4 week interval between the measles vaccination and oral polio (Sabin) or small pox vaccination.

Q. Can every child receive the measles vaccine safely? A. Yes, with a few exceptional children such as leukemia, generalized cancer, tuberculosis, convulsive disorders or marked allergy to eggs or dog dander should receive measles vaccine only upon advice of a physician familiar with their health problems. Children with high fever should have vaccination postponed until temperature is normal and there is no other evidence of illness.

Q. Is a gamma globulin shot for measles exposure the same as vaccination? A. No. Children who receive gamma globulin for measles exposure receive lasting immunity only if they subsequently develop a mild case of measles. Children who did not develop mild measles after receiving immune globulin may still be susceptible and should receive the vaccine.

Q. Who should receive measles vaccine? A. Healthy children beyond the age of 1 year who have never had measles or measles vaccine. Q. Is measles vaccine needed by older children and adults? A. No, because nearly all people over the age of 15 have had measles, and thus are already immune.

Q. Will other immunization interfere with the measles vaccine? A. Diphtheria-Whooping Cough-Tetanus Immunization (DPT) will not interfere. However, there should be at least a 4 week interval between the measles vaccination and oral polio (Sabin) or small pox vaccination.
