Take Precaution In Holiday Travel

A maximum of precaution and care in holiday travel was urged today by officials of the Automobile Club of Washington as they set down the annual year-end safety campaign.

Mingling long hours of darkness with a great number of pedestrians, Christmas decorations with traffic lights, and long holiday travel plans with the traditional "cup of cheer" provides a combination that adds a number of hazards to the holiday season, said Ayres Johnson, Auto Club Safety Director.

Emphasizing the need for added care and caution, Johnson urged all motorists to be alert and listed several tips for holiday travelers.

"Avoid window shopping when behind the wheel of your car, no matter how festive the windows are. Don't pile Christmas packages so high in the car that your vision is obscured."

"Remain alert for traffic lights to avoid mistaking them for Christmas decorations."

"Watch for bundle-loaded pedestrians, as they may not see you. If you have been partaking of alcoholic drinks, don't drive home from the party. Let someone else, or take a cab."

"Be alert for playing children who perhaps are not as attentive to traffic as they should be."

"Darkness comes early. Drive extra-carefully on last-minute shopping trips."

"Take extra caution in inclement weather."

"Remember your responsibility toward your family. Christmas is family time and many automobiles are packed with children, yours as well as others."

This year, Santa was grounded by weather and his arrival at the airfield was made by automobile where he was transferred to the waiting fire engine.

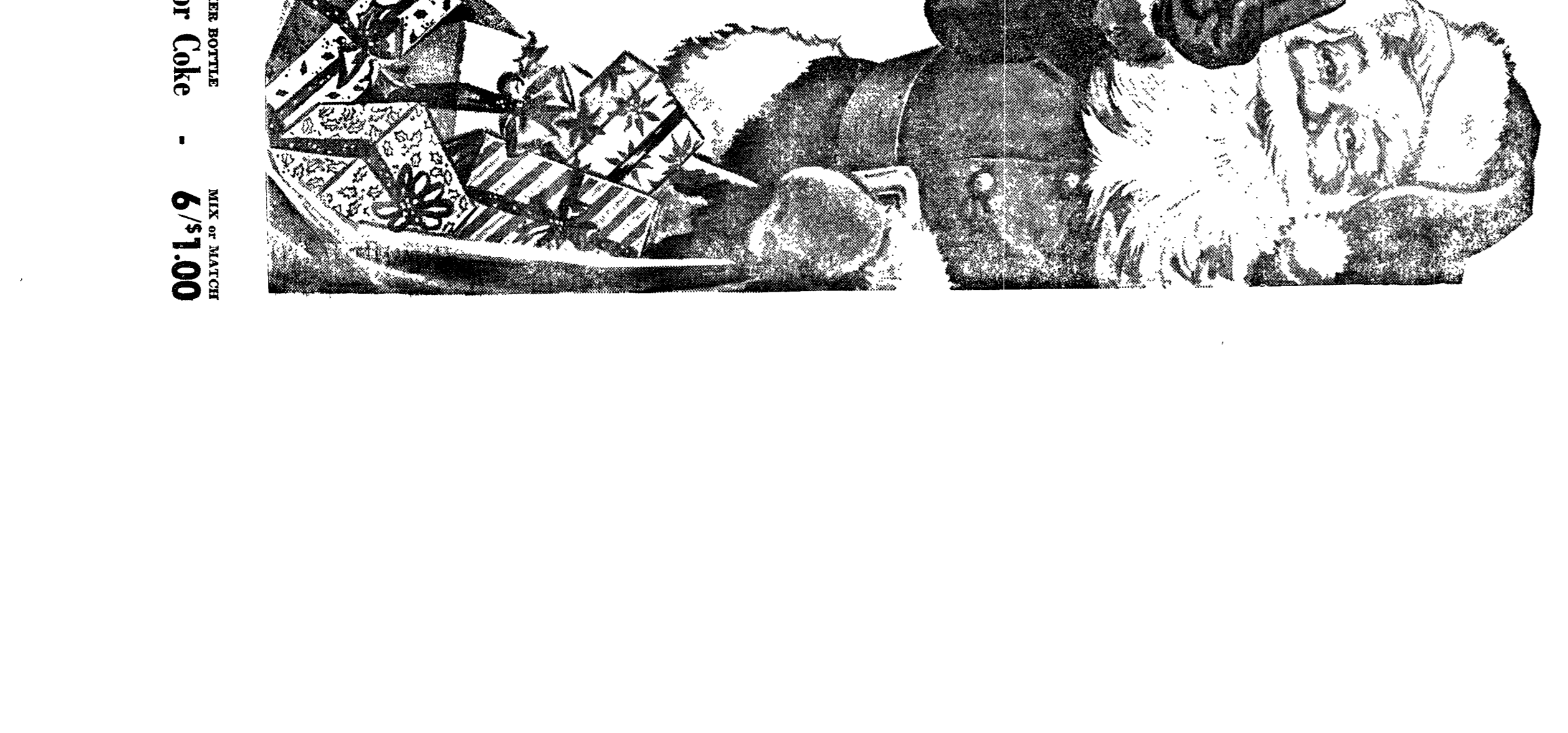

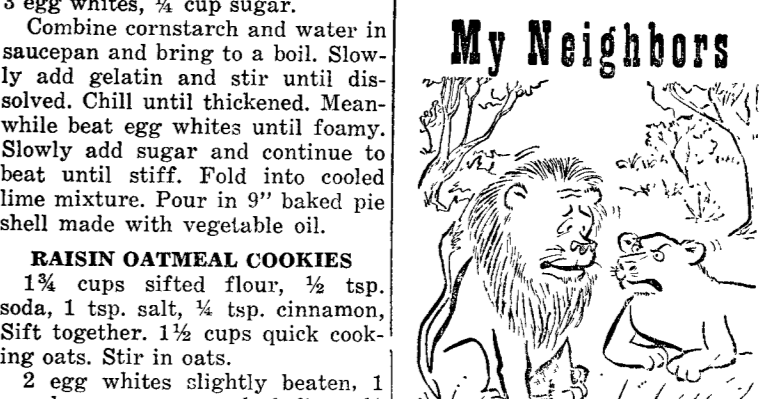
