Every employee who receives cash tips of \$20 or more in any calendar month while working for an employer, must report the amount of tips received during the month to that employer...

Cash tips are subject to withholding of income and Social Security taxes and must be reported to the employer on or before the 10th day of the following month...

The Internal Revenue Service has available free of charge Document 502, "Employer's Daily Record of Tips and Report of Tips to Employer," which explains briefly the requirements of the law...

... Let There Be Light ...

It wasn't too many years ago that electricity in the home was considered a luxury. But now dozens of home conveniences depend on the ubiquitous electric wire.

Not so in a small community along Washington's most western shore. Until recently the Indian village of Quetsa was never supplied with electricity even though it is located along busy U. S. Highway 101.

Quetsa, one of several villages of the Quinault Indian tribe, has 28 homes, one gas station, a school and a hotel. Anyone who has driven the beautiful coast highway probably remember Quetsa as a hodge-podge of small dwellings 20 miles west of Lake Quinalt. Nowadays it bears only slight resemblance to the past.

The transformation began more than two years ago when the Bureau of Indian Affairs kicked off a pilot project to provide Quetsa with new homes, a new sanitation and water system, streets and sidewalks. On hand to assist the Bureau were workers of VISTA—"Volunteers In Service To America"—from the Office of Economic Opportunity. Each resident signed an agreement either to pay the full cost of the home or as much as possible, or to accept payment, volunteer a like amount of labor.

The village of Quetsa was selected for the project because most homes were sub-standard, health care was virtually nonexistent and the construction of new homes was considered a high priority.

Complete records help to insure that taxpayers do not overpay their taxes and also make the job of preparing the tax return easier. Mr. Wangling said that a copy of your 1966 return is one of the best guides for preparing your 1967 return. He also pointed out that thru 1968, you should accumulate records and receipts to ease your tax filing job in the following year.
