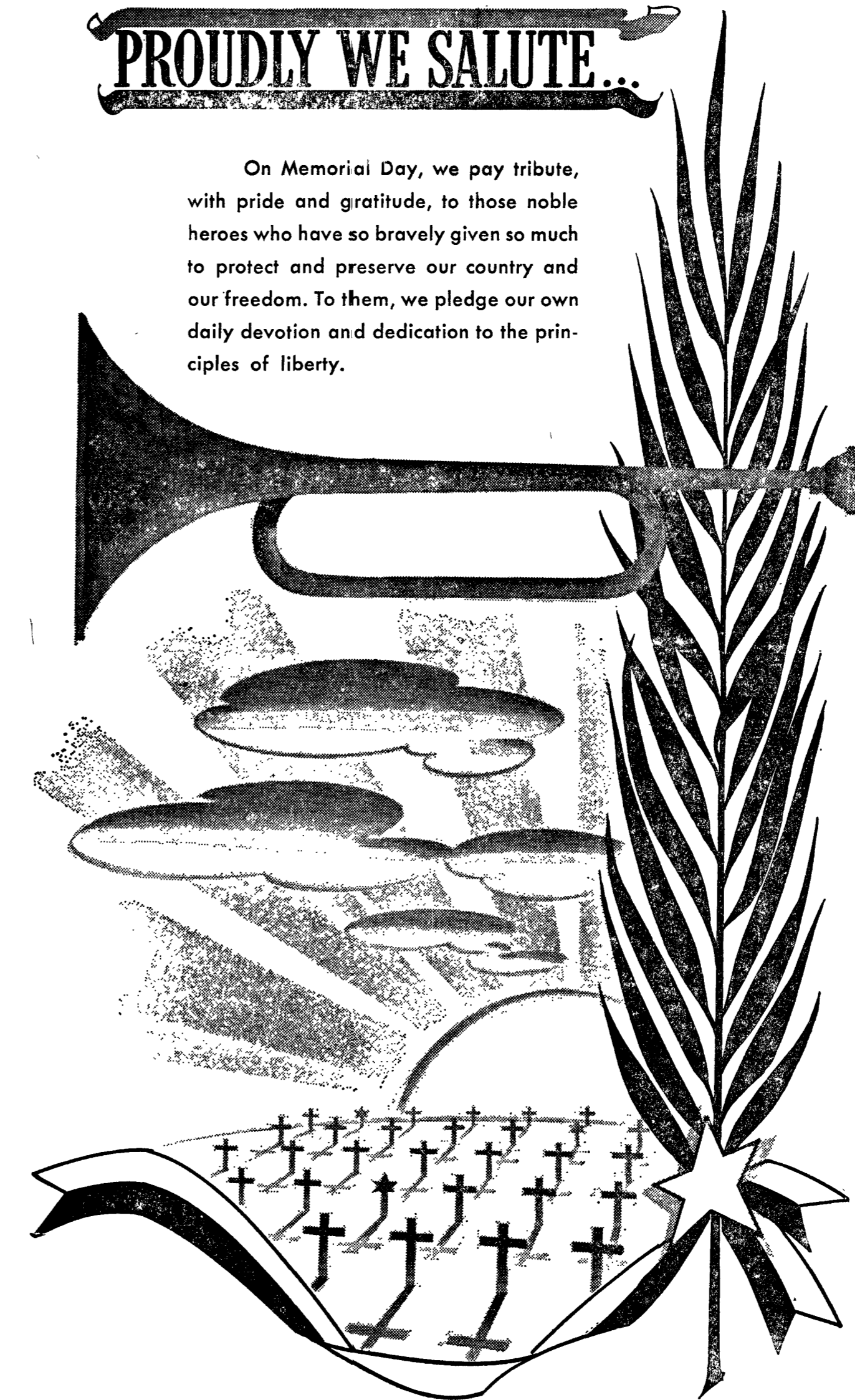

Cheryl Bryson was awarded a certificate as editor of the Spartan Gazette.

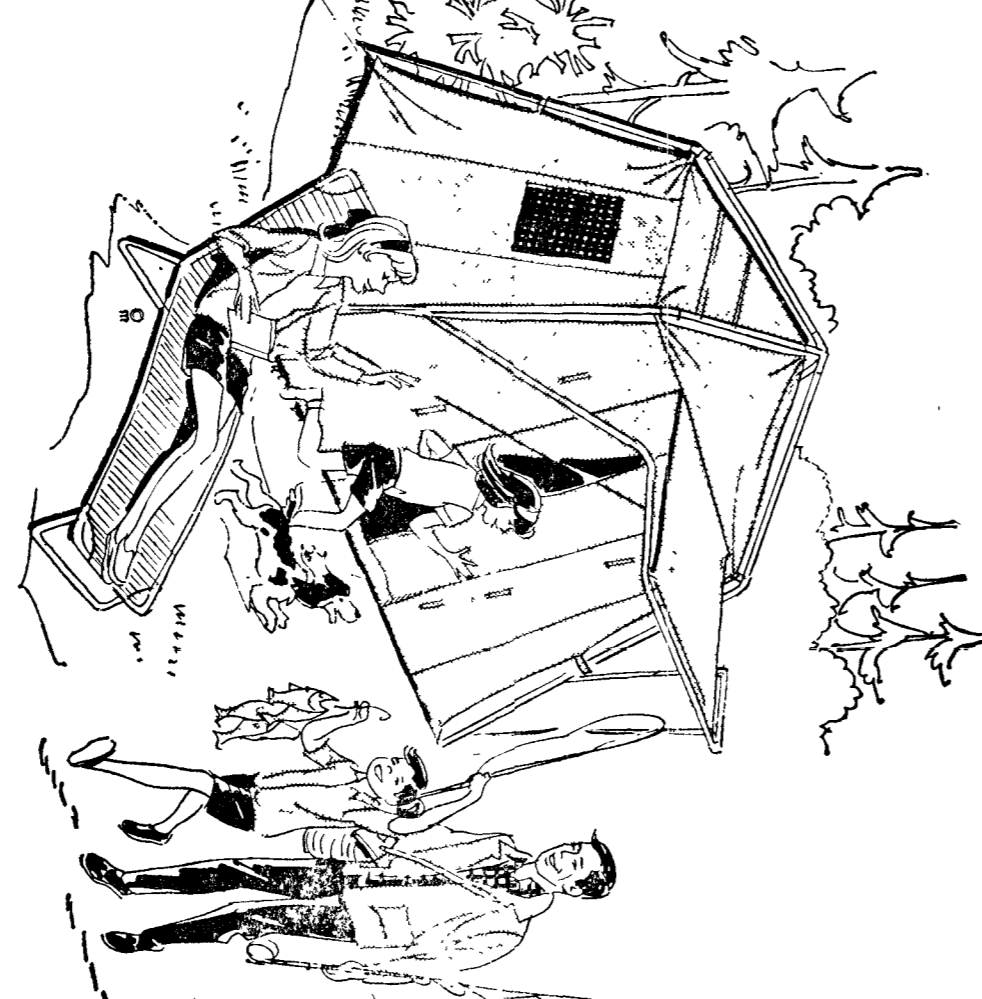
