SUMMER HOME



Multiple Injury Accident

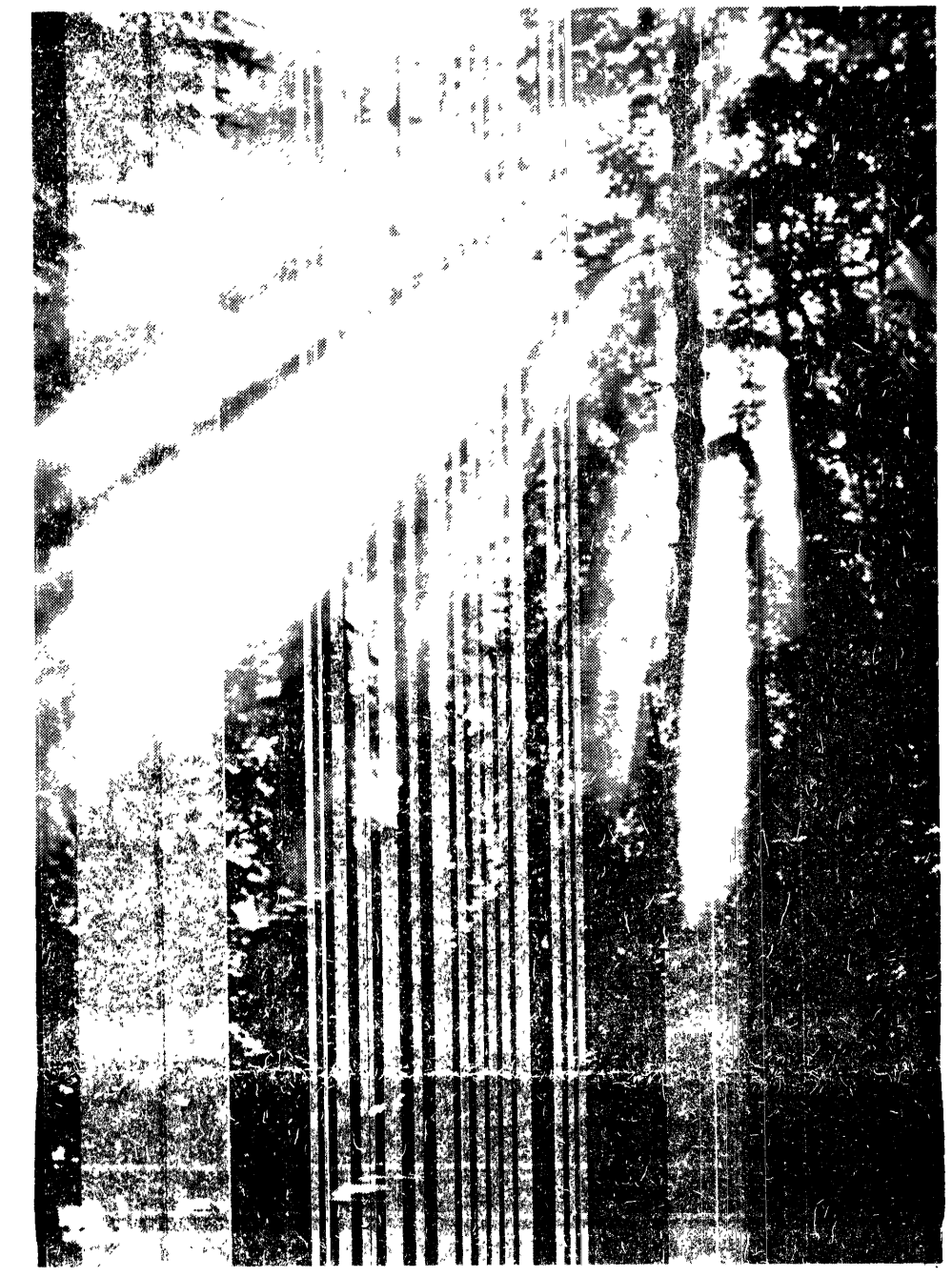
There was only one serious accident in the Forks area over Labor Day weekend according to the Washington State Patrol.

Four people including a boy, age 6, were injured when a 1960 Ford pickup and a motor-driven by James G. Cavanaugh of Seattle left the road one-half mile south of the state highway dead end Flat of Flats.

Injured were the driver Gudvang, Claude Chabagl, his son Victor, and Harry Riggsby of Seattle.

The driver apparently fell asleep at the wheel and lost control of the vehicle. The truck left the road and traveled for 420 feet on the right shoulder, dumping the carper in which the people were riding. The truck continued on for 110 feet crossing to the left shoulder before striking a tree.

The injured were taken to Forks Community Hospital.

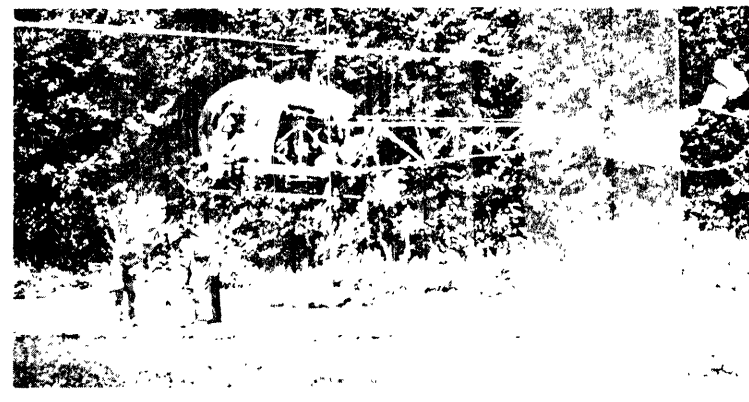

Helicopter Used In Fire Fight

The use of a helicopter in fire control for the area was demonstrated recently by Carl Spee of Alpine Helicopters Inc., of Seattle, the "ceptor, a Bell 47, is under contract to the Forks District Department of Natural Resources.

DNR Fire Crew Saves Seagull Nesting Grounds

The Forks District Department of Natural Resources fire crew worked hard to save the seagull nesting grounds in the area of the logging firm, and a fire chief, are trying to figure out how the fire started as another begins to burn in the area. by Lonnie Archibald

They reported fire control operations were a bit sticky because Carroll Island is literally covered with seagulls in every stage of development from nests full of eggs to fledglings unable to fly. About half the nesting grounds were saved from fire.

Council Rejects Bids

The bids for construction of the addition to the Town Hall were rejected at a special meeting of the Forks Town Council, August 27th.

According to Mayor Earl Kennedy the reason was not because the bids were too high but that there was only one bid for construction and one bid for electrical contract.

D. D. Peterson Construction bid for the addition and Fletcher bid for the electrical contract.

If approved the cost to the town would be approximately \$28,000, this would have included an addition to the meeting area and the construction of a new marshal's office and cell block.

The council will decide at a later date whether or not to reopen bids.

Mrs. Norris and Bert Maris from the Clallam County Humane Society were present to explain that the society is primarily interested in caring for dogs that are sick or abandoned and that the society cannot help the town solve their dog problem. It was recommended the council pass an ordinance similar to the Port Angeles ordinance, that dogs must be under control or confined to their own premises. The dog owner would be responsible for their dogs.

The retirement plan for city employees was approved by the council. Coverage will be for full prior service and will be co-ordinated with Social Security.

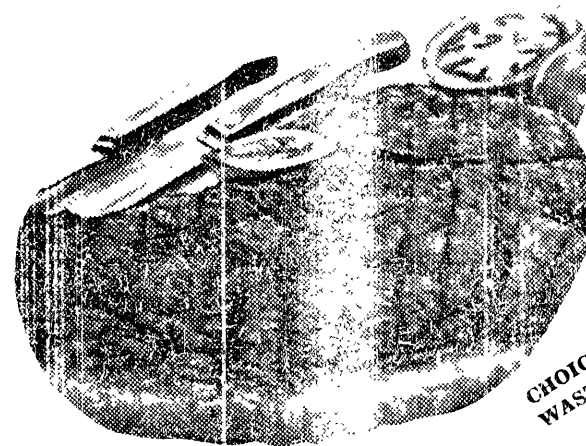
