

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# REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR Periodical Subscription Services

## I. INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- A. The North Olympic Library System announces this Request for Proposals (RFP) for the purpose of obtaining information and firm bids for provision of periodical subscription and related vendor services.
- B. All qualified firms interested in providing these services to the Library are invited to respond to this Request for Proposals.
- C. The Library reserves the right, without penalty, to add, remove, modify or otherwise update this RFP, in any way the Library sees fit, provided that such modifications shall be submitted with due notice prior to the deadline for submission.
- D. This invitation does not commit the Library to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of proposals nor commit the Library to select any proposer that responds.
- E. The Library reserves the right to waive any irregularities or informalities in procedure, and to reject any or all proposals without penalty. Any and all submissions may be rejected for any cause. Further, the Library reserves the right to cancel this project with or without reason.
- F. Vendors shall comply with all management and administrative requirements established by the Washington Administrative Code (WAC), and the Revised Code of the State of Washington (RCW), and any subsequent amendments or modifications, as applicable to vendors licensed in the State of Washington.
- G. Pursuant to RCW 42.56, all proposals submitted under this RFP shall be considered public records and, with limited exceptions, will be available for inspection and copying by the public.

#### 2. HOW TO RESPOND TO THIS RFP

Questions must be submitted no later than. June 3, 2014.
- B. **Proposal submission.** To be considered for selection, proposers must submit a complete response to the RFP as defined in this section. Proposals must be received at the North Olympic Library System's Technical Services Department, 2210 South Peabody Street, Port Angeles, WA 98362 on or before 4:00pm Pacific Standard Time on June 17, 2014. Confirmation of receipt of email submissions are the responsibility of the vendor.

- C. Vendors that can demonstrate the ability to deliver the proposed services and can provide three references are asked to submit a proposal or detailed price quotation for complete service that includes the following:
  - I. Provide a detailed price quotation for periodical subscription and related vendor services. The Library prefers a one year contract.
  - 2. State the vendor's full company or corporate name and give the official representative(s) name, address, telephone number, fax number and email address as well as the vendor's office location responsible for performance under a contract with NOLS. Also include the URL for the vendor's web site.
  - 3. Provide pertinent background information about your company. Vendors may also highlight here any new and/or innovative services that they have developed for library customers during the past several years.
  - 4. Proposals must be signed by a corporate official, owner or a person who has been authorized to make such a commitment.
  - 5. The Proposal should clearly state the total length of time during which the services, and any related prices presented in the proposal are valid and reliable. It is required that this time period be no less than one hundred twenty (120) days from the date the proposals are due.

### 3. <u>TIMELINE</u>

The Library seeks to confirm its costs for the fiscal year with a one year contract period beginning January 1, 2015.

#### 4. PAYMENT

The Vendor is asked to invoice the Library on a yearly basis.

#### 5. ABOUT NOLS

Background: The North Olympic Library System is a public library system providing services, programs and materials to the public at four branch libraries. The system consists of the main Library in Port Angeles and branches in Clallam Bay, Forks and Sequim, as well as outreach services for people who cannot travel to the Library and an array of web-based services at <a href="https://www.nols.org">www.nols.org</a>. The Library offers a collection of more than 260,000 books, DVDs, digital audio books, e-books and other materials, and circulates over 900,000 books and other materials per year. The Library also offers Wi-Fi access, public computers, a wide array of programs and events for children, teens, adults and families, and much more.

#### 6. ABOUT NOLS SERIALS

The North Olympic Library System currently carries 392 print periodical subscriptions.

Subscription terms are for one year. It is required that the common expiration date for the majority of the subscriptions be December 31<sup>st</sup> and the common start date begin January 1st. NOLS receives and processes the bulk of its magazine and journal issues at its Service Center in Port Angeles, WA. Newsletters and newspapers are mailed by publishers directly to branch locations. Claiming is processed centrally from the Port Angeles Service Center.

#### 7. SCOPE OF CONTRACT

The primary goal of this Request for Proposals is to establish purchase agreements for periodical subscription services for the North Olympic Library System. NOLS is seeking a vendor to provide cost effective and timely delivery and maintenance of periodical subscriptions as well as other related vendor services including: online renewal of expiring subscriptions, placement of new orders, online claiming and missing copy replacement service.

The North Olympic Library System currently uses the Polaris integrated library system. MARC records for periodical titles are included and maintained in the NOLS online catalog. Individual magazine and journal issues are circulated to the public and holds (reserves) can be placed on specific issues in the catalog.

#### 8. PROPOSAL CONTENT

Proposals should be brief, concise and responsive to the specific requests in this section.

- A. Include a brief discussion of your company's reputation and examples of successful provision of similar services to other clients.
- B. Provide the names and contact information for at least three clients receiving services similar to those requested in this RFP.

#### 9. **VENDOR SERVICE INFORMATION**

Please note any fees that would be charged by the Vendor for any of the services described below. If a service that is described is not one that can be provided by your company please mark as "NA" (not applicable)

#### A. Ordering

- 1. Ordering: The majority of new subscription orders are placed by NOLS in conjunction with annual subscription renewals beginning January I<sup>st</sup> and ending December 31<sup>st</sup>. Please describe your process for placing new subscription orders with publishers and the average lead time for new subscriptions to begin.
- 2. Occasionally, NOLS will need to place orders for new subscriptions during the subscription year. How does your company accommodate "mid-year" subscription requests and can these subscriptions be pro-rated to expire with the library's set common expiration date of December 31st?
- 3. NOLS carries many multiple copy subscriptions which are delivered to our Service Center address. How does your company communicate about and help insure accurate fulfillment of bulk copy orders and deliveries for multiple copy subscriptions sent to a central location?
- 4. Describe how your company facilitates electronic ordering of new subscriptions.

#### B. Claiming

- 1. NOLS prefers to use electronic claims. Describe how your online system facilitates electronic claims.
- 2. Does your company offer missing copy replacement service?
- 3. Describe how urgent claims can be expedited. For example, is it possible to speak directly to a customer service representative to handle a claim outside of the regular claims processing procedure?
- 4. Describe the claim process to publishers, follow-up, average turn-around times, and provide samples of any claim forms that would be used.

## C. Invoicing

- I. An itemized summary invoice providing a grand total for all locations combined is to be supplied. NOLS uses multiple funds when ordering periodicals. Does your company offer the ability to use different fund codes, and then indicate the fund on statements and invoices?
- 2. What are your company's payment terms? Is there a discount for early or prepayments?

#### D. Cancellations and Credits

- I. How does your company notify customers about title changes or ceased titles?
- 2. Describe your company's policy for cancellations and issuing of credit. How does your company provide credit for canceled or ceased titles?

### E. Customer Service

- 1. Describe your company's customer support service and which staff would provide service for NOLS accounts. Include hours of customer service (for the Pacific Time Zone) and what methods are available (e.g. email, toll-free, fax, etc.) to reach customer service staff.
- 2. What are your typical response times to customer queries?
- 3. Does your company typically assign a dedicated customer service representative to handle a particular library's account?
- 4. Does your company maintain an online database of periodical titles and provide access to library customers?
- 5. What reports can your company provide on a regular schedule or on demand? Can your company provide access to a report that includes information such as title, ISSN, frequency, subscription length, start and end dates, and number of subscriptions?
- 6. Can your company provide projections for future year renewal cost and estimated price increases for the coming year?

## 10. RENEWAL LIST PRICE QUOTE, DISCOUNTS AND TERMS

For the purpose of this bid, renewals for 2015 are listed in Appendix A.

The renewal list includes the following information:

- I. Title
- 2. ISSN Number
- 3. Current number of copies of subscriptions up for renewal in 2015.

The price quote on our renewal list should be for January I-December 31 (one full year) giving one total with an "each" price by the title. The percentage discount should be clearly noted for the entire list. All other charges, in addition to the subscription costs, must be listed separately; i.e. service charge, delivery or shipping and handling charge, sales tax and any other charges (please specify). Please note clearly which, if any, titles your agency would not be able to provide subscriptions to for NOLS.

## II. <u>SELECTION CRITERIA AND PROCESS</u>

Proposals will be evaluated by a committee consisting of the Library Director, Technical Services Manager and two Technical Services Assistants. Proposals will be evaluated on the following basis:

- A. Quoted costs and discounts.
- B. Responsiveness to the scope of services outlined in this RFP (ability to provide services requested by NOLS).
- C. Qualifications of the vendor, including experience and qualifications of relevant staff
- D. Quality of references.

Final selections will be based on the evaluation of proposals, and vendors may be requested to provide additional information after submitting proposals and prior to selection.
