Library Display B: July 2-August 16 Display supplies must be gathered and ready to be implemented by Monday, July 2.
Coding Club with the Boys and Girls Club Volunteers will help plan and assist with implementing coding tutorials online for special Boys and Girls Club visits to the Port Angeles Main Library. All volunteers assisting with coding club MUST be able to attend coding training. This is a great way to work with kids! After attending tutorial, volunteers can assist with other sessions as available.
