Become a Teen Leader at the Library

Gain valuable leadership and event planning skills this summer! Teen Leaders will assist with special event development, help other volunteers, plan trainings, and develop displays for the library. Each Teen Leader will be required to work on an agreed upon individual or group project throughout the summer, and will have the opportunity to earn service learning hours towards their high school letter or graduation requirement. Students who have volunteered at NOLS in the past are preferred, but previous experience is not required. All Teen Leader applicants must be attending high school or the Running Start program in the fall of 2018 (9th-12th grade). This year, there will also be a weekly meeting to work on projects.

Trivia Questions

Each year, the library hosts trivia nights for fourth graders (Battle of the Books), seventh and eighth graders (BookWars), and a trivia competition for adults. During the competition we draw from a huge bank of questions, made up by staff and volunteers. Questions must be original (so that contestants can't find) and must be kept confidential. Volunteer work is done independently; reading time counts as part of your volunteer hours. All questions **MUST** be typed. Books may be checked out from library or borrowed from the Youth Services office. Speak to library staff for more information.
