NOLS News

The Library will be closed Monday, March 29 through Saturday, April 3.

NOLS has a \$163,000 budget shortfall and this one-week closure will save approximately \$36,000. All library staff will be put on unpaid leave. The website, book return bins, meeting rooms and buildings will be shut down. The Library will reopen on Monday, April 5.

The Library Board is implementing this week-long library closure, and a second one in late summer 2010, to help close an anticipated \$163,000 budget shortfall. The savings by not paying employee salaries for the closure will amount to about \$35,000 for each one-week period. Other savings in such areas as utilities are estimated to be about \$1000. The balance of the shortfall will be made up by other personnel reductions, buying fewer new books and other materials and by transferring approximately \$88,000 from the Library District's reserve funds. The budget gap is the result of the cumulative effects of inflation, the loss of timber revenue, and Washington law which caps the Library's property tax budget at no more than a 1% increase per year without a vote of the people.


