New Gadget at NOLS Want to reduce your power bill?



Check out a Kill-a-Watt™ Energy Detector Toolkit at any NOLS library to measure the amount of electricity your household appliances use. It calculates how much energy and money is being spent on an hourly, daily, monthly or yearly basis. Use this tool to help determine whether or not it's time to replace an old appliance, use it less, or unplug it when it's not in use.

The Clallam County Public Utility District (PUD) and NOLS have partnered on this project to bring watt detectors to residents throughout the county.


Hunt will lead a workshop on writing memoirs.

Volunteer: Stephanie Gilmore

Date started volunteering at NOLS: February 2010

Volunteer role: Stephanie volunteers with the Outreach Program on Monday and Friday afternoons. She selects library materials for Outreach patrons, as well as checking in and checking out items.

What motivated you to volunteer at the library?


What do you like best about volunteering at NOLS?
