Five little books, sitting on a shelf. Look inside and see a little elf.


Four little books, all in a row. Look inside, see it start to snow.

We're Going To The Library


We're going to the library (echo)

Art Projects

Bookmarks

One of the easiest ways to help protect a book's spine is to use a bookmark. Take construction paper or your choice, stickers, foam shapes, markers, crayons, color pencils, whatever inspires you and decorate a bookmark to use the next time you need to mark your spot.

"Publish" your child's story
