"Fahrenheit 451" by Ray Bradbury

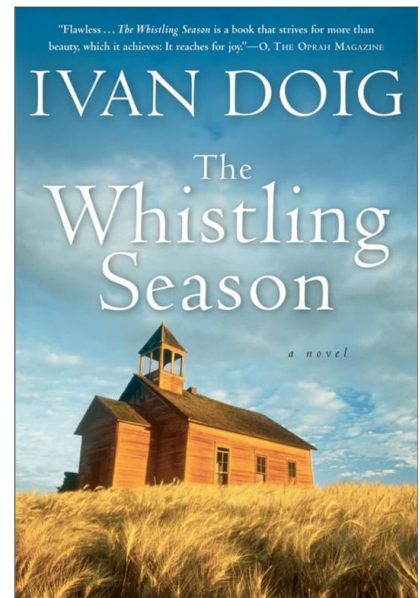
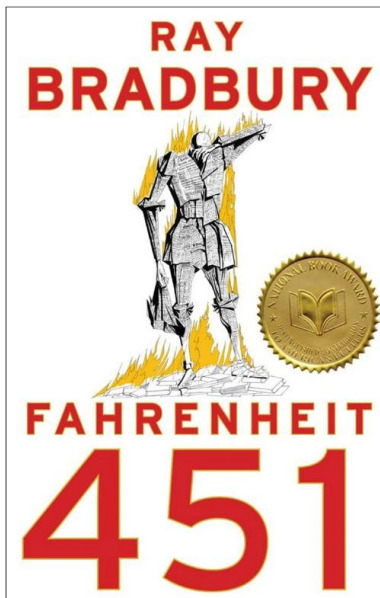
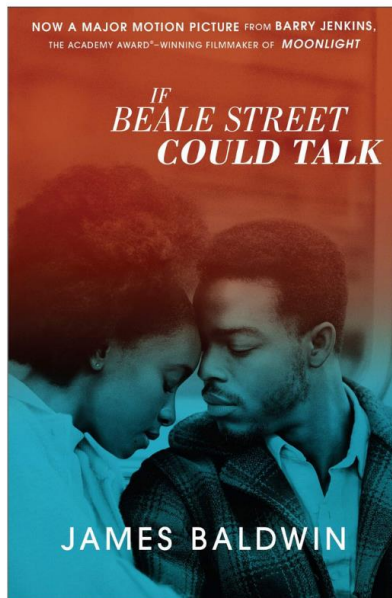
