Olympic National Park’s Perspectives Speaker Series concludes for the season with “[Coastal Bluff Erosion at Kalaloch](#),” a presentation by Dr. Ian Miller, coastal hazards specialist with Washington Sea Grant. The free hybrid event is set for Tuesday, April 8, at 7 p.m. Attend the presentation at the Port Angeles Main Library, 2210 S. Peabody St., or join the livestream using the Zoom link at [NOLS.org/ONP](#).

Miller will discuss erosion of the bluffs at Kalaloch, documented through ground surveys and aerial lidar conducted over the last two decades, and available analyses of the site dating back to 1974. The presentation includes early photo monitoring results from five Chronolog community-science photo stations set up in 2023 to further track the bluffs. Erosion at this site presents a variety of management problems, placing buildings and recreational infrastructure at risk.
