The North Olympic Library System (NOLS) invites teens and tweens to connect with their peers, have fun and help shape future programs at their local library.

All NOLS branches offer opportunities for teens to build leadership skills and earn community service hours. The Sequim and Port Angeles libraries host monthly Teen Advisory Board meetings, where teens can collaborate with staff to plan events and create an engaging, supportive library environment.

- First Wednesday of each month, 3:30–4:30 p.m., at the Sequim Branch Library
- Second Tuesday of each month, 3:30–4:30 p.m., at the Port Angeles Main Library

At Forks and Clallam Bay libraries, teen volunteer schedules are arranged individually. For details, ask at the library or email teens@nols.org.

Weekly and monthly events are also available for students to enjoy:

- **Teen Tuesday:** After-school activities and snacks are provided every Tuesday, 3:30–4:30 p.m., at the Port Angeles Main Library, and the first Tuesday of each month, 4:30–5:30 p.m., at the Forks Branch Library.

- **Tween Thursday:** For students in grades 4–6, this weekly hangout includes new activities, snacks and social time every Thursday, 3:30–4:30 p.m., at the Port Angeles Main Library.
- **Magic Monday:** Students in grades 4–12 can drop in to play “Magic: The Gathering” every Monday, 3–4 p.m., at the Port Angeles Main Library. Standard decks are available to borrow, or participants may bring their own. Extra basic land cards and snacks will also be provided.
