“This Is Your Mind on Plants” by Michael Pollan

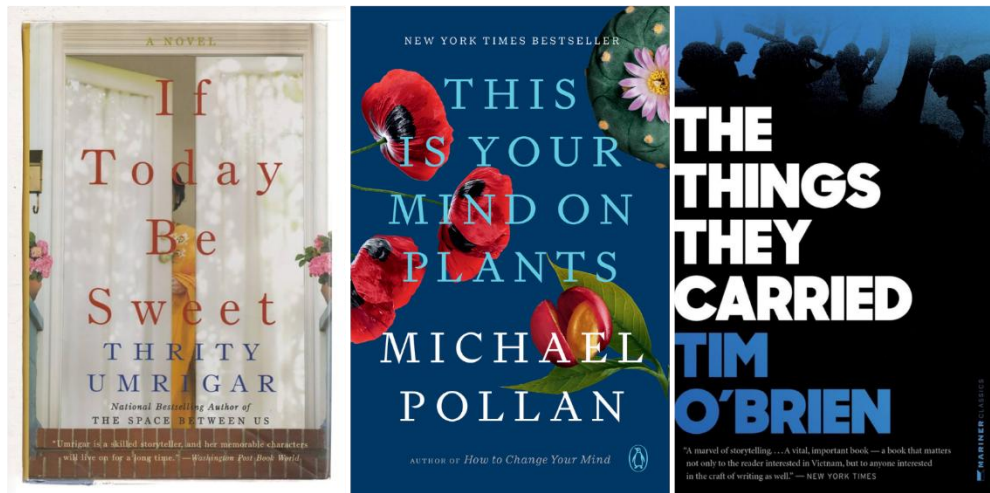
