Starting on Tuesday, October 4, at 6pm and meeting at the Sequim Branch of the North Olympic Library System on the first Tuesday of each month through December 6, teens in grades 6-12 can be part of the Sequim Library's new Young Adult Advisory Group.

Besides discussing good reads, members of the Young Adult Advisory Group will recommend services and programs they would like to see at the library. They'll suggest new books, movies, and other materials that the Library should buy, they will be among the first to hear about new materials, and they'll plan programs and events. Members can also become library volunteers, and in volunteering they will learn one way to give back to their community.

The first meeting will be a pizza party on Tuesday, October 4 at 6pm. Youth Services Librarian Antonia Krupicka-Smith will share information about young adult advisory groups at other libraries and she'll lead a brainstorming session to develop ideas for the Sequim group. At the next meeting on Tuesday November 1, also at 6pm, the group will discuss new books and other materials that teens would like to see in the Library. On Tuesday December 6 the topic will be technology, and planning will begin for an event during Teen Tech Week in March 2012.
