Gansango Music & Dance draws on the stunning talent of a multicultural group of international dancers and musicians presenting traditional and contemporary dance and music from West Africa. The company is directed by Etienne Cakpo, originally from Benin and now a teacher and choreographer based in Seattle, Wash. Gansango artists perform regularly in the Seattle area, as well as nationally and internationally for audiences of all ages.
