Participants can choose from tutorials designed for all ages; themes include Minecraft, Wonder Woman, Star Wars, Moana, science, math, social studies, language arts, art, media, music, and more! These sessions are open to youth and adults with a limited number of laptops and iPads available for use during the hour.

Computer Science Education Week is an annual program dedicated to inspiring K-12 students to take interest in computer science, held in honor of Admiral Grace Murray Hopper, a computer science pioneer and career US Navy member. Libraries across the country provide computer science programs to support innovation and provide members of the community with access to technology. Although *Computer Science Education Week* programming is typically geared towards young people grades K-12 in school programs, several of the programs being offered at NOLS are for adults as well as children. Programs are held in conjunction with Library efforts to encourage problem solving and critical thinking skills in young people and help provide preparatory experiences for a 21st century workplace.

Computer Science Education Week programs are presented in partnership with the Washington State Library, the Institute of Museum and Library Services, and Five Acre School. Programming
