Experienced Jazz Saxophonist Craig Buhler will share live tunes at 6:30pm on Friday, February 2 during the First Friday Art Walk at the Sequim Branch of the North Olympic Library System (NOLS). An artist reception celebrating the opening of the new *Art in the Library* exhibit will take place at 6pm, immediately preceding the performance. The *Art in the Library* exhibit will feature the work of photographer and adventurer Genny Langworthy.

About Craig Buhler

Craig Buhler is Director & first tenor sax with Sequim's Stardust Big Band and the Carmel Big Band Workshop. He is co-director of the Northwest Big Band Workshop and Director of the two Big Bands at Camp Heebie Jeebies. Among his 30 recording credits are 9 CD's under his own name. Craig is a charter member of the acclaimed California rock band HONK, which toured nationally with the Beach Boys, Loggins & Messina, Chicago, Santana, and others before audiences of 10,000+. HONK has released five CDs, and continues to sell out San Juan Capistrano's Coach House as well as other California venues. Buhler is the author of two books on music: *New Ears Resolution* and *Keys to Music*.

Art in the Library

The new *Art in the Library* exhibit features the photography of Genny Langworthy, and will be on display from February 2 through May 29 at the Sequim Branch Library.

Genny Langworthy is an adventurer and photographer who often calls a kayak her office. Langworthy shoots mostly landscapes and seascapes, and many of the images are shot from water level in her trusty kayak. Her pieces capture the natural splendor of British Columbia, Western Washington, Quebec, Cape Breton and mainland Nova Scotia, as well as Newfoundland Labrador. All of Langworth's pieces are custom-framed by her and, as such, the framing is part of the artistry.

Images shot from a kayak by photographer and adventurer Genny Langworthy create a panorama of the rugged, beautiful, and often treacherous coastline of Newfoundland, Labrador, and the Pacific Northwest. She presents a visual journey of the most magnificent sights, from the unique perspective of a sea kayaker.
