The Clallam Bay Branch of the North Olympic Library System (NOLS) will host *Dino Dig with the Burke Museum* on Thursday, September 20 from 12-2pm. Children will take a journey through geologic time as they examine real fossils, rocks, and minerals, as well as cast replicas of dinosaurs and other prehistoric animals and plants. There will be opportunities to unearth fossils in dig pits, learn about the work of paleontologists and geologists, and imagine the amazing life that once inhabited the planet.

About the Burke Museum

The Burke Museum is a research and collections based museum located in Seattle. It serves many audiences and communities including Washington state residents, tourists and visitors to Seattle, educators and students, Indigenous and Pacific communities, and researchers, scholars, and enthusiasts. The 16 million objects (and counting!) in the Burke collections are used for education and research throughout the state of Washington. The museum is responsible for the Washington state collections of natural and cultural heritage and sharing the knowledge that makes them meaningful.

The Dino Dig is part of the Burke Museum's ongoing efforts to bring the museum throughout the state of Washington. The North Olympic Library System is a host for the museum's pilot effort, which is supported through the museum's cost assistance program.
