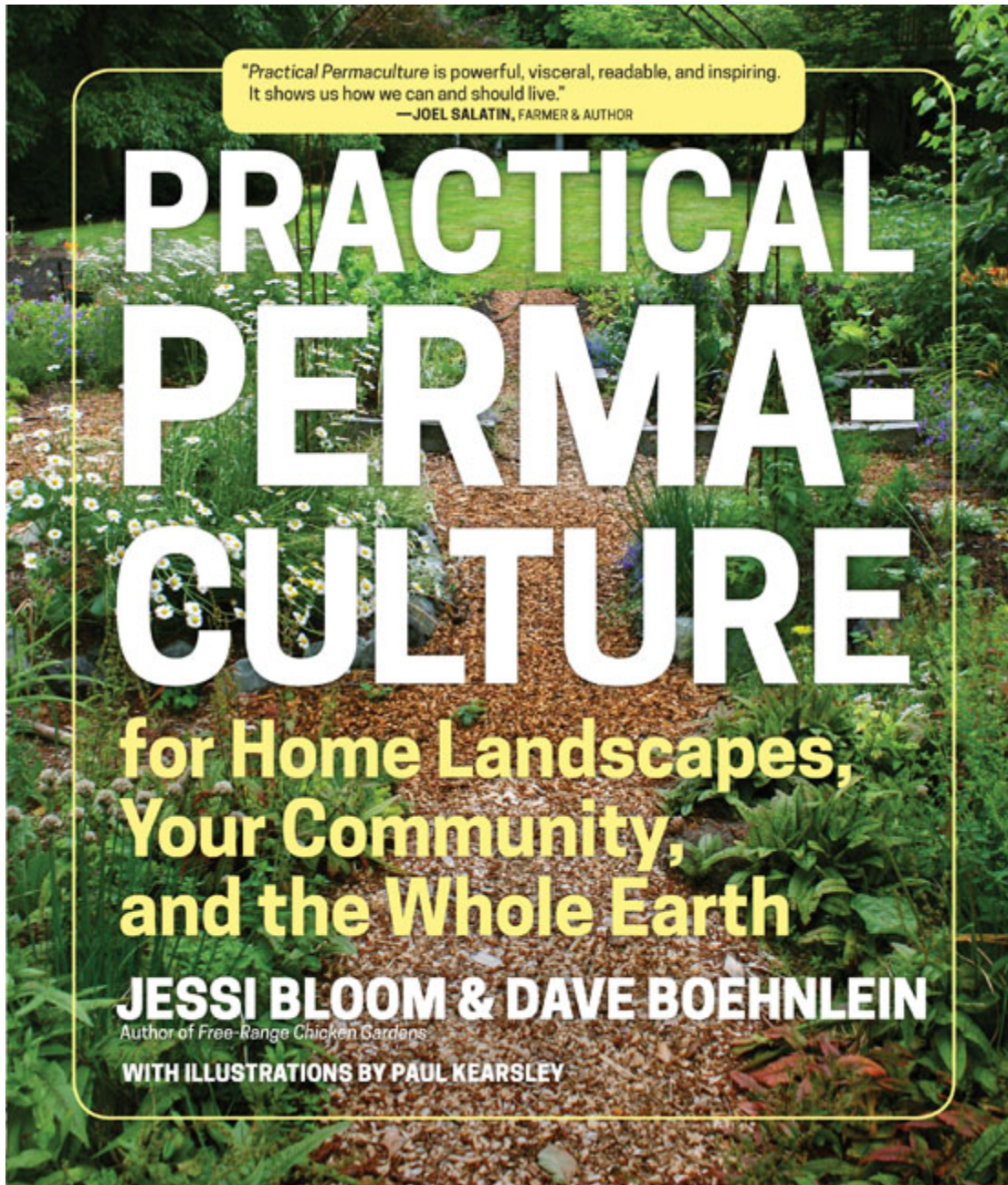
Curious about permaculture, or thinking of planting a sustainable garden to be more self-sufficient? David Boehnlein, co-author of *Practical Permaculture for Home Landscapes, Your Community, and the Whole Earth*, will present at the North Olympic Library System (NOLS). Boehnlein will discuss plant all-stars in the Northwest, and homestead resiliency (planning for climate change and other uncertainties). Talks will take place at the Port Angeles Main Library on Friday, March 29 at 6pm, and the Sequim Branch Library on Saturday, March 30 at 10:30am.

David Boehnlein serves as the education director at Bullock's Permaculture homestead on Orcas Island. He is also Principal and a founder of Terra Phoenix Design, helping people achieve sustainability around the globe. Boehnlein offers Permaculture Design courses through Bastyr University's Holistic Landscape Design Certificate Program, and Alderleaf Wilderness College's Wilderness Certification Program. He is a member of both the Cascadia Permaculture Institute and the Permaculture Institute of North America.
