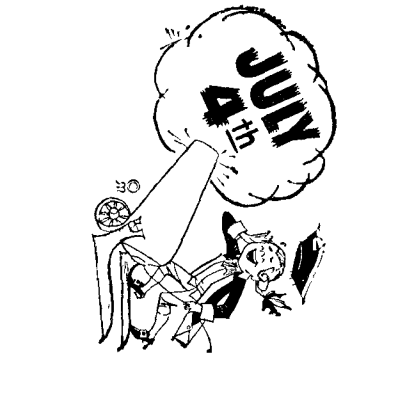

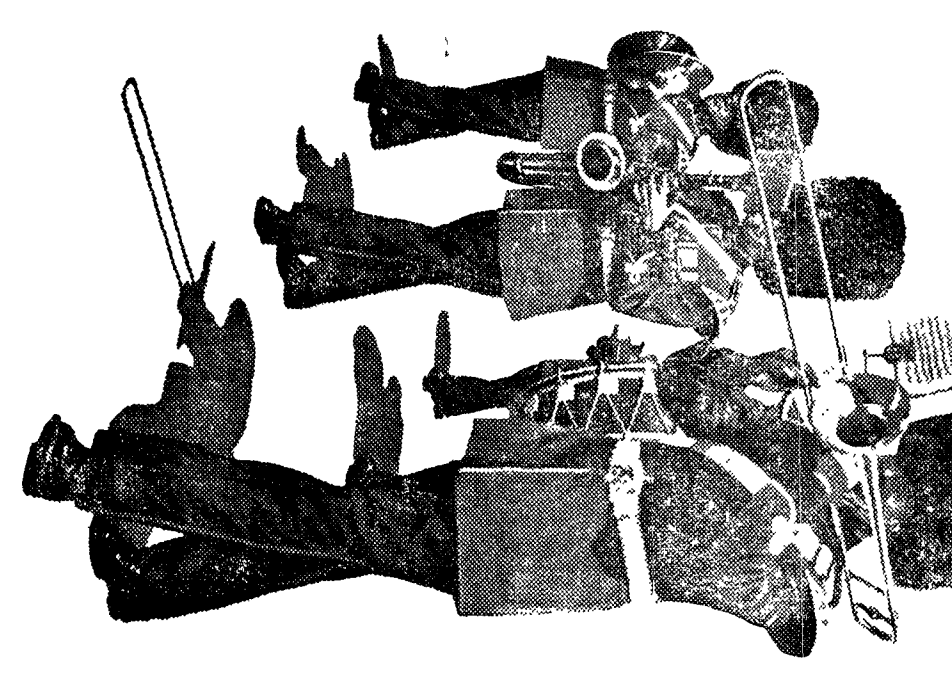

RESOLUTION HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT

WHEREAS, primary State Highway 8, sign route 101, between Govan's Hill and Fairholm Hill is heavily traveled highway, posing local and tourist traffic; and
WHEREAS, the alignment and width of said road creates a very definite hazard to both trucker and motorist because of lack of visibility at any speed and proper width for passing or meeting; and
WHEREAS, there are insufficient areas for tourist and sight-seers to park while viewing the natural wonders of the North Olympic scenery; and
WHEREAS, traffic will be increased by improved highway conditions from Astoria north and Seattle west to this area; and
WHEREAS, highway improvement has been made on both sides of this section of road.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the State Timber Utilization and Development Committee urges the Washington State Highway Department and the National Park Service to make every effort to provide for adequate improvement to this section of the route so that traffic can flow in a normal and safe manner.

Thinning Land Sales Stepped Up

State Land Commissioner Bert Cole announced the Department of Natural Resources will step up the number of thinning sales on state-owned forests. During the next biennium, covering the period from July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1967, the state plans to offer about 75 thinning sales on the harvest of selected trees within a timber stand prior to their maturity and the final cutting of the entire stand. This thinning utilizes trees that would normally die as the stand grows older and the number of trees per acre decreases. The thinning of trees from the heavier forest stands also permit the remaining trees to grow more rapidly and better.

"Our thinning sales will enable the state to place more timber on the market and to meet the current demands of the industry. The thinning sales also help our forest management programs and provide additional income and economic growth," Cole said.
