Mr. Guy Lesure who was guest of honor at an open house birthday party three weeks ago was born in Spring Brook, Wisc., Oct. 31, 1913, and came to Washington in 1935, in his 22nd year. He arrived at Chillum Bay on his way to Forks, and took three days to make the trip. During his 70 years residence in the West End he has been a first home owner, close to the Sal Dam, about a mile west of Sappho. After he moved to his present home a short distance above the present Sappho his first home was used as a school house.

He served for many years as fire control officer in the area between Forks and Chillum Bay. He was always much interested in education and served as a director of the Forks High School board.

He served for 10 years as County Assessor, and ran compass and sealed for Blood-Donovan in the early years of the company in charge of the county. Mrs. Lesure's parents owned the old Sappho Hotel and store, across the road from Mr. Lesure's present home.

Mrs. Lesure served as a nurse for the phone service for 27 years and operated the switchboard from her home until the system was bought by Boyd Schaefer some 30 years ago.

While Mrs. Lesure operated the switchboard, Mr. Lesure took care of the phone lines and could be seen almost any day traveling along the highway in the old Mack T Ford car he used. There is much more...
