But a sizeable steelhead fishery also exists in the summer months. Washington's summer steelheadery takes over 50,000 fish which is about one-fifth of the total annual steelhead catch. The size of the summer steelhead fishery has been increased significantly in recent years, due to hatchery programs increasing the return of summer-run fish to Washington's streams.
Several regions of the state contain streams that are good for the summer-run; best fishing usually comes from June on. In District 10, try the Hoh, Quinalt, and Quets. In District 5, good summer-run streams are Kalama, Klickitat, Lewis, Wind, Washington, White Salmon, Toulle, and Lower Columbia. District 7, summer steelhead catches are to be had in the Skyline, Snoqualmie, Stillaguamish and Tolt. In Central and Southeast Washington, try the Upper Columbia, Wenatchee, Yakima, Snake and Grande Ronde.

Relax... You'll Live Longer

LEARN YOUR SKILLS; EARN YOUR FITNESS
Most Americans do not understand what physical fitness really is. Very few people realize that physical fitness is something which they must constantly be doing in order to maintain much less to build up and acquire in greater programs. The average individual plays once or twice a week very often believes this will keep him fit. Such is NOT the case.
The skill which the golfer has attained means that he has practiced enough with each of the clubs so that he has a reasonable command of their use. This skill is something which the golfer has learned and learning implies the successful use of the brain. It implies the ability to repeat the proper grip, stance, backswing and downswing movements indicate that he has learned and can repeat. His ability to repeat these habits, patterns acquired through practice using his central nervous system.
The golfer learns to correct his mistakes by following the advice of a teacher or by studying a film of proper form. The learning results from his ability to understand what is required of him to master the technique which is being taught. This same line of reasoning applies to any muscular skill. Thinking of riding a bicycle, learning to type or play the piano, learning the diverse coordinations between hand, foot and eye in learning to drive a car. The point is this: one can learn to use his skills named he will be able to use them at any time in the future with little loss of ability and can regain former skill rather rapidly. Skills involving the nervous system, such as riding a bicycle, are learned forever! This is definitely NOT the case with physical fitness.

Timber Sales Sold

Twenty-three parcels of state-owned timber were sold at public auction May 22 and 23, bringing in bids totaling \$2.2 million. State Land Commissioner Bert Cole reported 100,102,000 board feet were sold during the monthly sales. The state offered 28 parcels and 5 were not sold due to the lack of bidders.
The largest volume of timber offered in one sale was in the Quets Ridge No. 2 sale in Jefferson County. The Quets Ridge No. 2 sale of 17.6 million board feet offered. The Aberdeen firm of \$511,650 was the highest single transaction of the month.
The timber offered for sale was located in the following counties: Clallam, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, Kitsap, Klickitat, Lewis, Mason, Okanogan, Pacific, Pierce, Pend Oreille, Skagit, Snohomish and Whatcomish.


