KIRO EDITORIAL REPRINT ATHLETIC BOYCOTT The contradiction in the civil rights movement was never more

evident than at the track meet held in the new Madison Square Garden in February. About 500 pickets showed up to battle police and try to disrupt the event. And what were they protesting-police brutality? Segrega-

tion? Discrimination? No. believe it or not, they were picketing their own athletes-Negroes who wanted to compete in the track events. Yes, the pickets even attacked a Negro runner and broke his glasseseven though he was wearing his Air Force uniform at the time. One Negro who competed was Lennox Miller of the University of Southern California. And incidentally, he won his event, the

60-yard dash. Miller told reporters afterwards that the so-called boyce at of Negroes in athestic events is misrepresenting the Negro cause. He said he didn't like to be ordered to stay out of competition by someone who doesn't know what athletics is all about. We applaud this young man and the eight other Negroes who competed in the New York meet, for the courage to stick with their convictions-even faced with the threat of violence. We think that Negroes have everything to gain and nothing to lose by using their talents whenever they can best apply, including athletics. With the Olympic Games coming up this summer, it would be foolhardy for Negro athletes to deprive themselves of the fame and honor to which they are entitled, just to promote

a dubious propaganda effort. When Negroes suffered violence at the hands of the police in Selma, Alabama, they won the sympathy of most of the nation. But when they attack other Negroes trying to force them to act again t their own consciences, they don't deserve support. This is not civil rights, but a civil wrong.


